GENERAL RULES & CONDITIONS FOR COMPETITORS

- 1. **COMPETITORS**: These competitions are open to amateurs whose regular income is not derived mainly from the exercise of his or her talents in the particular section in which he or she is competing.
- 2. A NOVICE: A competitor who has never won a first prize as a solo competitor in previous competitions, including Societies within NZ.
- 3. AGE LIMIT: A competitor's age is reckoned as *at the first day of the Competitions* of *the current year*, with the exception of singers in the senior section (16-18) where singers who are aged 18 and still attending secondary school may compete. Each competitor, when called on to do so, must satisfy the Committee of his or her age, or be disqualified. Singers aged 18 years old who perform in the DPACS Junior Vocal Competition may not perform in the DPACS Senior Vocal competition in the same year. Competitors may not compete in other than their age group except in Vocal Duet and Emsemble Classes, where competitors must perform in the age group of the oldest competitor.
- CUPS AND TROPHIES: Must be returned clean and in an appropriate condition by Friday to the Convenor, at 62 Greenock Street, Kaikorai, Dunedin 9010 by 14 July 2017. Failure to do so will incur a fine of \$10.00. All trophy winners are responsible for the engraving of their names. Trophies are held for one year.
- 5. **TIES.** If two competitors tie for first place, the prize money for first and second shall be combined and divided equally.
- 6. **PRIZES.** In addition to monetary prizes and trophies where specified, certificates will be issued for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places.
- 7. ORDER OF APPEARANCE. Competitors' names appear in the programme in the order

in which they will be called upon to perform. All competitors must be in attendance **15** *minutes* before the class commences.

- 8. **PROTEST.** Any competitor desiring to protest must do so in writing, setting out the grounds, and lodging it with the Secretary together with \$10.00 as a guarantee of bona fide. Should the committee, after investigation, deem the protest to be frivolous or unfounded, the deposit will be forfeited. No protest will be considered unless lodged within 24 hours after the results have been announced. No protest can be made against any decision of the adjudicator.
- **9. ADJUDICATOR**: No competitor, singing teacher or interested party, other than the committee, shall have contact with the adjudicator during classes.
- **10. REPEATS:** No item performed in one class may be performed in another.
- **11. PROMPTING:** No prompting shall be given during the performance, except at the Adjudicator's discretion.
- 12. **MUSIC**: Must be available for the adjudicator at least 15 *minutes before* the commencement of the class. It must be handed in at the Music Table, and be clearly marked with the *class number*, *competitor's name* and *competitor number*.
- **13. MUSIC COPIES:** Competitors must supply two copies of the music, one for the adjudicator and one for the accompanist. Both copies must be in the same key.
- 14. **REPETITION OF PERFORMANCE:** No competitor, having won first prize with an item at any previous Dunedin Performing Arts Competitions Society's Festival, shall present this item again.
- 15. TIME LIMIT: Contestants are encouraged to observe a time limit of <u>four minutes</u> for all own choice items, except where a *special* time limit is specified in the syllabus
- **16. SUBDIVIDING**: The committee reserves the right to subdivide classes after entries have been received, should class numbers exceed reasonable limits.
- **17. SPECIAL PRIZES:** Special prizes will not be awarded if fewer than three competitors perform, except at the discretion of the Adjudicator. The Adjudicator has the right to withhold prizes if a suitable standard is not attained.
- **18. DRESS:** It is expected that all performers will be dressed in a manner suitable for their performance.
- **19. REPORTS:** Report sheets will be available from the secretary's table at the end of each session.
- **20. NO ENTRIES** will be accepted from students taught by the Adjudicator in this and the previous year.
- 21. PRE-RECORDED ACCOMPANIMENTS are not permitted as accompaniment in vocal/ instrumental classes with the exception of Classes 213, 216 and 217 in the Junior Vocal Competition. For these classes, singers must indicate on their entry form if they wish to use a backing track, and these must be presented (on a USB drive) to the Music Table at least half an hour before the beginning of the class for which they are intended. Backing tracks may also be emailed to the convenor up until a week before the beginning of the

competition.

- 22. REGULATION REGARDING PHOTOCOPYING: Please note The original printed music must be available at all times either for the adjudicator or for the performer. Failure to comply with this regulation may result in disqualification.
- 23. **PROGRAMME:** The programme, which is the only timetable, will be on sale two weeks before the Festival. Copies will be available from Beggs Music Works, Moray Place, and also from the Convenor. Copies are also posted to competitors on request.
- 24. **RECORDING PERFORMANCES:** Anyone wishing to video or record a competitor's performance *must first obtain the permission of the Convenor.*
- 25. Entry to these competitions is deemed to signify acceptance of these conditions

Entries received after this date will be accepted if classes are not full, on payment of a late fee (see below)

ADJUDICATOR - Amanda Atlas

New Zealand dramatic soprano Amanda Atlas embarked on her international career in 1999, spending ten years singing for various opera companies and orchestras in the US and Europe. Role highlights include Verdi's Amelia, Alice Ford and Desdemona; Puccini's Tosca, Suor Angelica, Musetta, Mimi, and Madama Butterfly; Poulenc's one-woman opera La Voix Humaine; Mascagni's Suzel (L'amico Fritz); Weill's Rose (Street Scene); and Offenbach's Giulietta.

Ms Atlas is now based in New Zealand and Australia. Recent engagements include Magda Sorel (The Consul) in New York, soprano soloist in Verdi's Requiem, Gerhilde and Sieglinde (cover) in the NZSO's tour of Wagner's Die Walkure, Senta (cover) for New Zealand Opera, Witch/Mother (Hansel and Gretel), Bruckner's F Minor Mass, Strauss' Four Last Songs, and

Mahler's Second Symphony with the CSO. 2016 saw her make her New Zealand Opera debut singing Annina in La Traviata, and she has just returned from making her Opera Australia debut singing Siegrune in their internationally acclaimed Ring Cycle. She began her 2017 singing Leonora in II Trovatore with Melbourne's CitiOpera, and her upcoming engagements include singing the soprano solo in Beethoven's 9th Symphony with the Christchurch Symphony Orchestra, and a return to the role of the Witch in Hansel and Gretel with Opera South.
